For the disaster you don't see coming.

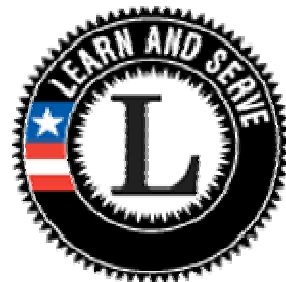
The School Business Partnership Class of Central Middle School has researched and provided this Earthquake Preparedness information for Camp Fire families as a service learning project funded by Learn & Serve America. We urge you to think about the safety of your entire family and create a preparedness kit, using the following information as a guide.

Have Disaster Supplies on Hand:

- A portable battery operated radio and extra batteries. This will be a way for your family to hear about shelters in the area that are open for you and your pets.
- Flashlight and extra batteries.
- Emergency food and water for 3-7 days.
- Non-electric can opener.
- Medical records and other important documents, including out-of-state emergency contacts.
- Essential medicines.
- Cash and credit cards.
- First-aid kit and manual.
- Blankets and sleeping bags.
- Tools, such as a wrench for water and gas turn-off.
- Clothing, including sturdy boots, work gloves, and winter clothes.
- Plastic bags for waste and weather protection.
- Candles and matches.

*Place the supplies you'd most likely need for evacuation in an easy to carry container, such as a backpack.

Earthquake Preparedness Tips for Pets:

- Take your animals with you. There will be shelters for animals as well as humans in case of a disaster.
- Make sure your pets have identification tags and that you have proof of ownership, as well as medical history. Pets will have to have proof of vaccinations to be admitted to shelters.
- Pet medication.
- Food, water, and bowls.
- Maintain current photos.
- Crates or kennels for transportation.
- Leash.
- Favorite toys or treats.

7. Guns, Ammunition, Pepper Spray, Knives, Clubs, Bats & Slingshots.
8. Hand-can openers.
9. Honey/Syrups/white, brown sugar.
10. Rice - Beans – Wheat.
11. Vegetable Oil.
12. Charcoal, Lighter Fluid.
13. Water Containers.
16. Propane Cylinders.
17. Survival Guide Book.
18. Thermal underwear.
19. Baby Supplies.
20. Mop and Bucket.
21. Cookstoves.
22. Vitamins.
23. Propane Cylinder Handle-Holder.
24. Feminine Hygiene Products.
25. Saws and axes.
